## **VETERINARY COLLEGE BRINGS EXPERIENCED RADIOLOGIST ON BOARD**

Dr. George Henry has recently joined the faculty at the University of Tennessee College of Veterinary Medicine as an associate professor of radiology. Dr. Henry, the former chair of the American College of Veterinary Radiology examination committee, is an expert in ultrasound. "It's fulfilling to be part of a program that has always been well thought of among its peers and continues to lead the way with cutting edge technology and teaching. The excellent instructional program here was a significant factor in my decision to come to the University of Tennessee."

Dr. Greg Daniel, radiology section chief at the college says Dr. Henry brings years of experience and expertise in ultrasound to the section. "Ultrasound is an important modality and new graduate veterinarians are expected to have working knowledge of ultrasound. We are planning to expand our educational experience in ultrasound and Dr. Henry will play a pivotal role in that endeavor. We are fortunate to have someone of Dr. Henry's caliber join our faculty." Dr. Daniel expects Dr. Henry will not only benefit the students, but practicing veterinarians as well. "We will be able to enhance our continuing education program by offering ultrasound short courses for practitioners."

Dr. Henry taught at Texas A&M College of Veterinary Medicine and Oklahoma State University. His move to Tennessee is a homecoming. Dr. Henry previously owned the Village Veterinary Hospital in Maryville from 1974 until 1982.
